**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends the following:

- 1) Introduction of new employees from the Police and Public Works Departments; and
- 2) Presentation of commemorative certificates and pins to employees who have completed 15 or more years of service to the City.

**FISCAL IMPLICATION:**

There are no fiscal implications associated with the recommended actions.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City has a tradition of welcoming new employees by introducing them at Council meetings on a quarterly basis. This gives new employees an opportunity to meet the Councilmembers and Department Heads and experience firsthand how Council meetings are conducted in the City. This tradition includes presenting commemorative certificates and pins to employees who have been with the City for 15 years or more.

**DISCUSSION:**

1) Introduction of New Employees

Police Officer Mark Vasquez graduated from the Los Angeles Sheriff's Academy in July. He has an AA degree in General Studies from El Camino College and a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Cal State Dominguez Hills. He previously worked in sales and marketing as well as construction.

Bryan Dwinell is our new Maintenance Worker I/II in the Streets Division. He is state-certified to operate heavy equipment and has experience in the field of vehicle repairs/diagnosis. He previously worked for California Department of Transportation as a Highway Maintenance Worker.

Maintenance Worker I/II Garret Stephen was also hired in the Streets Division. Garret has worked in maintenance and construction. His experience in operating various tools and equipment is essential in his work with the City.
